Youth Justice Trainings

UUCSJ Youth Justice Trainings range from one to two weeks. With partners like Boston Mobilization in Boston, Mass., and the Center for Ethical Living and Social Justice Renewal in New Orleans, La., participants gain hands-on skills to help organize, transcend boundaries, and engage in justice work grounded in UU theology. Participants create community across differences and leave with a deeper understanding of themselves and the work of social justice.

August 9–15, 2014: Seattle, Wash. \$1,100 per person. New program!

Mississippi Civil Rights Journey

This program is a unique, multigenerational, one-week journey exploring the U.S. civil rights movement in the '60s, voter suppression efforts in the present, and how we can each engage in the struggle for racial justice moving forward.

UUCSJ has teamed up with the UU Living Legacy Project to offer this special social justice pilgrimage for high school youth and adults. On a journey that coincides with the 50th anniversary of Freedom Summer, you will meet the people, hear the stories, and visit the sites that changed the United States and had ripple effects throughout the world.

Our 2014 Civil Rights Journey will be a multigenerational trip that includes programming for high school youth. Financial assistance is available.
